The Fall application is open NOW.



- Some scholarships are due prior to March 1—watch the deadlines!

# Letters of Recommendation

**REMINDER**: Do not wait until the last minute to request a letter of recommendation. When you ask someone to write a letter, give

them your resume or a personal data form and allow 3 weeks to complete. Follow up with a written thank you note!



Letters of recommendation are often difficult to write and require a great deal of time, please show your appreciation!

# Semester Class Changes



If you have applied to  $\zeta$ any competitive fouryear colleges and have

made significant changes to your class schedule for the spring semester, you should notify the college(s) as soon as possible to determine if it will affect your chances of admission.



Take the **ASVAB** (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) on **February 22nd 1-4pm**.

Scores <u>may be</u> used for military entrance—or not if you choose not to! Sign up with Mrs. Escobar in the CCC.



Federal Student Aid FAFSA

Seniors can submit the FAFSA beginning October 1, 2020 for the 2021-22 school year. The FAFSA enables students to start the financial aid process and tap into the many federal and state resources that make college affordable. These resources include student grants, work-study, and loans.

The FAFSA will use the 2019 tax return for the 2021-22 school year. Students need this tax information to answer many of the questions. At the same time, you'll learn the preliminary estimate of the amount your family is expected to contribute to your education. It is known as the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and helps to determine any aid awards you might receive.
