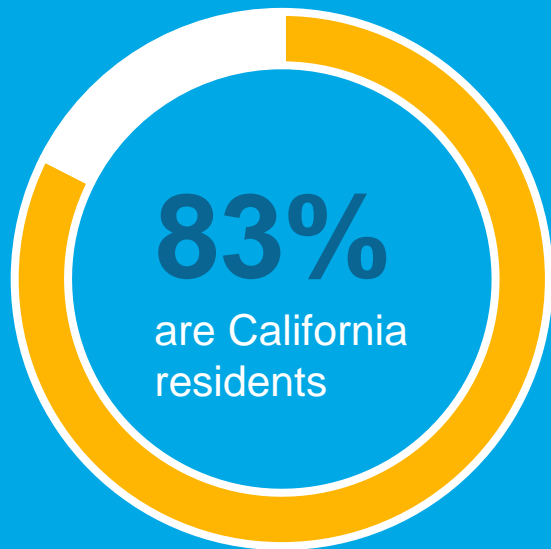

Applying to UC

Nine campuses, one application

- Opens August 1
- Select which campuses you'd like to receive your UC application
- \$80 fee for each UC campus (\$95 for international applicants)
- Fee waiver available for up to four campuses for qualified students

Applying as a freshman

You'll start as a freshman if...

You're currently in high school

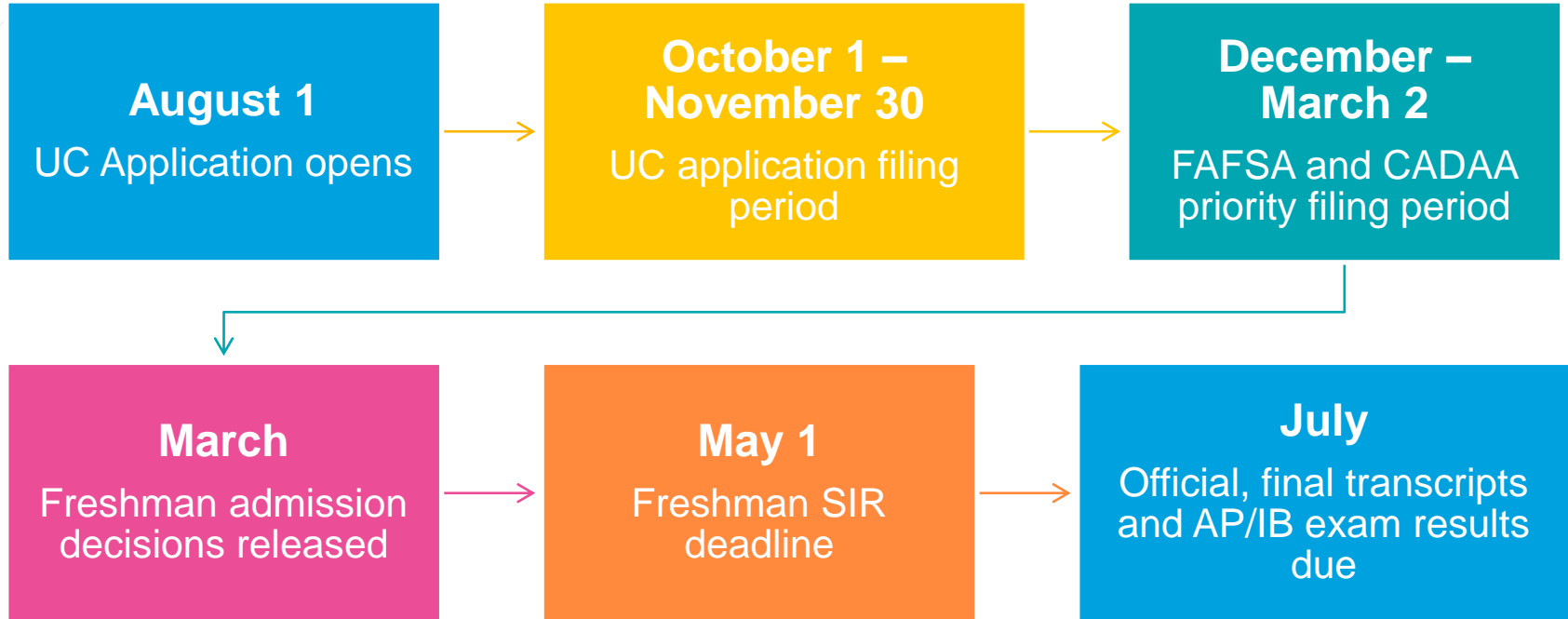
OR

You've graduated high school, but haven't enrolled in a regular session (fall, winter, spring) at a college or university.



You are still considered a freshman applicant even if you have earned college credit while in high school.

Freshman admission timeline



Minimum freshman admission requirements

**Complete 15
A-G courses**

**Earn a UC GPA
of 3.0 or better
(3.4 for
nonresidents)**

A-G subject requirements

A-G requirements

- Complete a minimum of **15** A-G courses with a grade of C or better
- Prior to beginning your last year of high school, you must complete 11 of these courses

Note: UC will accept Pass or Credit grades in A-G courses completed in spring 2020 through summer 2021 to meet A-G requirements.

- A. History** – 2 years
- B. English** – 4 years
- C. Mathematics** – 3 years (*4 years recommended*)
- D. Science** – 2 years (*3 years recommended*)
- E. Language other than English** – 2 years (*3 years recommended*)
- F. Visual and performing arts** – 1 year
- G. College-preparatory elective** – 1 year

UC GPA minimum requirement

- California residents: **3.0**
- Non-residents: **3.4**

Students should aim to exceed this minimum requirement to be a competitive applicant.

How the UC GPA is calculated

- Includes all letter grades from A-G courses taken during grades 10 and 11 (including the summers after 9–11)
- Grade points are based on the letter grade received; plus (+) and minus (-) grades are not factored
- Up to 8 semesters of extra points are added for passed AP, IB, college-level or UC-approved honors courses

Minimum requirements versus selection

Minimum requirements

- A-G coursework
- UC GPA minimum
- Consistent for all campuses

Selection

- Comprehensive review (13 factors)
- Varies by campus



Comprehensive review for freshmen

Academic achievement — GPA, curricular rigor, academic trajectory

ELC, honors programs, special projects

Personal, school and family context

Special talents, skills, awards, leadership

Life experiences and special circumstances

Learning more about you: Activities & awards

Activities and awards can include:

- Awards or honors
- Educational preparation programs
- Extracurricular activities
- Coursework other than A-G
- Volunteer/community service
- Work experience



Learning more about you: PIQs

Personal Insight Questions (PIQs)

- Respond to 4 of the 8 prompts
- All questions hold equal value
- 350 words maximum per response
- Focus on the content, not the style, of your writing
- May be used for admission and scholarship consideration

Applying as a transfer

You have left or graduated high school

AND

You have enrolled in a regular term at a college or university after high school

2.4 (CA residents)
2.8 (non-residents)

Eligibility versus selection

Major Preparation

- Certain majors may have required or recommended coursework
- Consider taking courses from other CCCs or online UC-transferable courses if your CCC doesn't offer a major preparation course
- Take full course sequences at one CCC

GPA

- Meet or exceed the minimum transfer GPA
- For selective majors, a strong GPA is especially important

IGETC

- Not required for admission; may be recommended for certain campuses/majors
- Full or partial certification is available


Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG)

What is TAG?

A guarantee for admission to a participating campus and a major, so long as all deadlines and requirements are met.

To be eligible for TAG, students must:

- ✓ Transfer from a California Community College (CCC)
- ✓ Complete over half of their units at the CCC
- ✓ Last attend a CCC before transfer



Students with non-CCC coursework and international students with a F1 or J1 visa can also be eligible for TAG

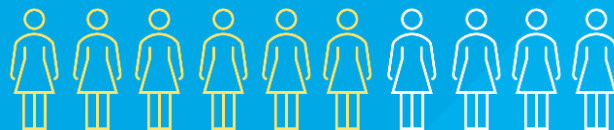
Results for California students

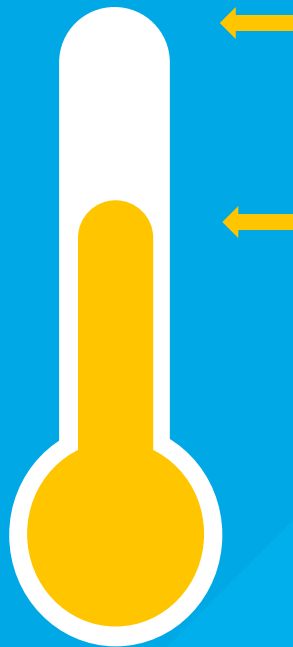
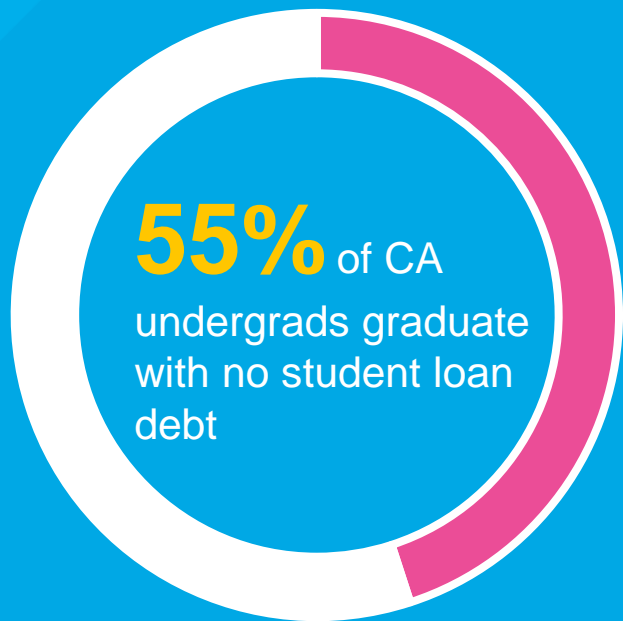
UC financial aid programs

For California residents who are eligible for financial aid and with a family income less than **\$80,000**, the Blue and Gold Opportunity Plan can cover the cost of your tuition, with extra funds available.

For California residents with family income and assets less than **\$217,000**, California's Middle Class Scholarship may provide scholarships to help with paying for college costs.
