October: If you are considering college athletics, register with

the NCAA/NAIA and let your Counselor know.

Take the PSAT and Online Practice ACT.

November: Take the ASVAB, a career aptitude test offered by

the military.

Sign up for an FLC Dual Enrollment course if

desired.

January: Take the virtual practice tests for the ACT and/or

SAT if your college(s) require them.

Springtime: Take the SAT and/or the ACT - sign up online (see

page 3).

Attend the annual Career Expo & Job Fair

Ongoing: Research colleges online.

Visit colleges during holiday breaks & summer. Look for scholarships & contests with cash awards.

#### **Register NOW!!!**

The Clearinghouse no longer requires SAT or ACT scores as an eligibility requirement for the class of 2025.

Transcripts must be uploaded to the Clearinghouse at the end of junior year (see our Registrar if you have questions about this).

Academic requirements are just as important as A-G's and actually require one more academic class than the 4-year college A-G admissions requirements. Stop by the CCC if you need your transcript reviewed.

### Explore Your Options in the CCC

If you haven't been to the College & Career Center lately, your Junior year is definitely the time to stop by for a visit.

- We have information on 4-year colleges, community colleges, technical schools, and apprenticeship programs. Many college representatives visit the College & Career Center to talk to interested students during flex time.
- Don't forget about the ROP program for job skill training. Taking an ROP class is an excellent way to enter the workforce with a highly marketable job skill.
- Military recruiters also visit twice each month during lunchtime. Juniors interested in the military academies or ROTC scholarships need to make contact this year to make sure all requirements are being met.
- Listen to the bulletin for weekly events, college information, and guest speakers in the College & Career Center.

Want to try a class at Folsom Lake College?

Students in grades 9-12 are eligible to enroll in college courses at Folsom Lake College or El Dorado Center.

- You may enroll in up to 11 units per semester. The process for Spring semester dual enrollment courses starts in Nov.
- There is a 2-step application process that requires both parent & high school counselor approval.
