




Apprenticeships



Advanced Education at the Community College

Get a head start on college by earning college credit while you are still in high school. No Enrollment Fees!

Qualified high school students are invited to take classes and earn college credit at any California Community College through the Advanced Education Program.

To participate, a student must:

- Be at least 16 years old OR have already completed the 10th grade by the first day of the college class, and be currently enrolled in high school
- Have a high school GPA of 2.7 or higher.*

Benefits of Advanced Education

- Earn transferable college credits while in high school
- Earn elective high school credits
 - 3 college credits = 10 high school credits
- Opportunities to explore electives PHS doesn't offer
 - (Examples: Kinesiology, Business, Astronomy, Geology, Criminal Justice, Sign Language)
- Take Career Technical Education classes
 - (Examples: Emergency Medical Technician, Early Childhood Education, Real Estate






