CAASPP Incentive

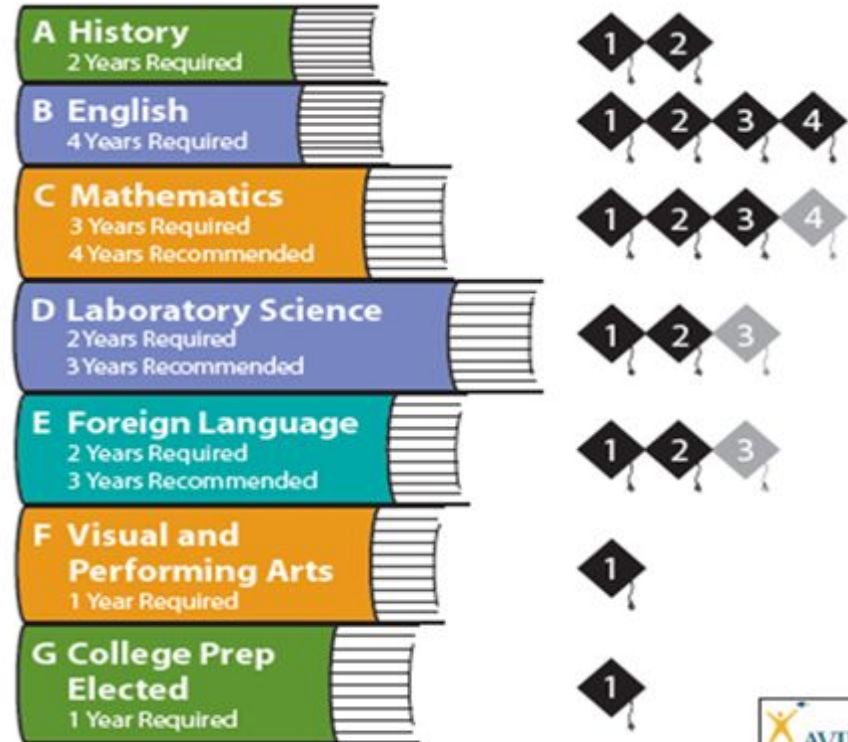

Dual Enrollment at the Community College

Get a head start on college by earning college credit while you are still in high school

- High school students are invited to take classes and earn college credit at any California Community College through the Dual Enrollment Program. The grades earned in Dual Enrollment courses will be reflected on a student's permanent college transcript
- Dual Enrollment students may enroll in up to 11 units during any semester



Dual Enrollment

- **Step 1 – Apply to Folsom Lake College**
 - <https://flc.losrios.edu/admissions/get-started-and-apply>
 - Look for two emails:
 - One from OpenCCC with general instructions on what to do next.
 - The other from Los Rios Community College District with your Los Rios Student ID number.
- **Step 2 – Complete the Special Admit Form**
 - <https://flc.losrios.edu/admissions/get-started-and-apply/dual-enrollment-admission-and-enrollment-steps>
 - Fill in the required fields.
 - Submit the completed Advanced Education packet to your high school counselor for approval.
- **Step 3 – High School Counselor Approval**
 - Your high school counselor will fill out their portion of the Special Admit Form (they will call you in if they need to meet with you) and will return the form to you.
- **Step 4 – Submit the Special Admit Form**
 - Submit the Special Admit Form by uploading it using the Online Submission Form found here: <https://flc.losrios.edu/admissions/get-started-and-apply/dual-enrollment-admission-and-enrollment-steps/submit-special-admit-form>
- **Step 5- Course Enrollment**
 - Folsom Lake College Admissions & Records will enroll you based on:
 - Your requested class(es).
 - The date/time of your priority registration appointment (priority 3 registration window).
 - You will receive an email when your Special Admit Form has been processed.

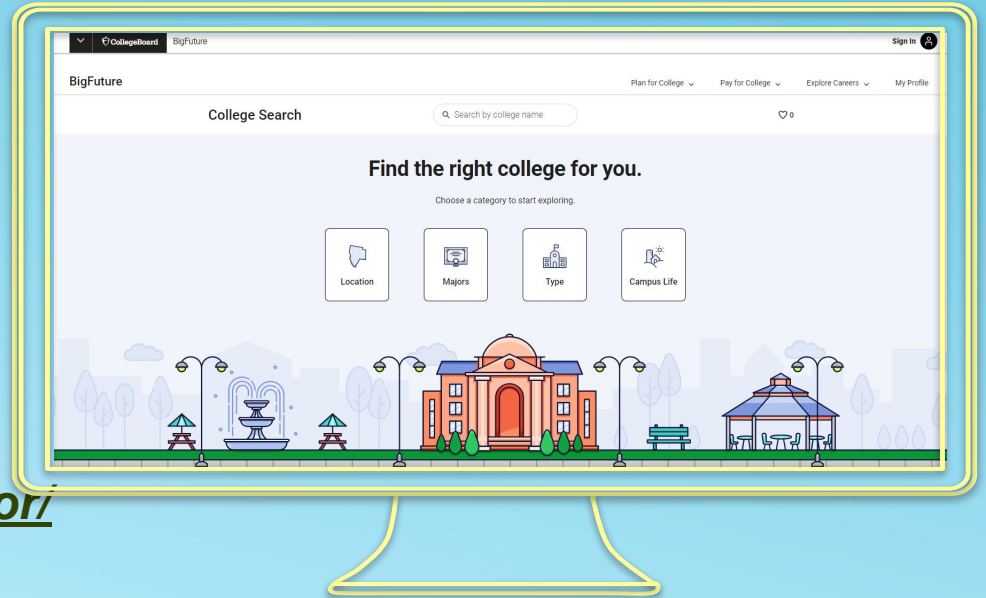

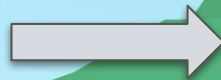
- Register or Create your Profile by the beginning of your Junior year

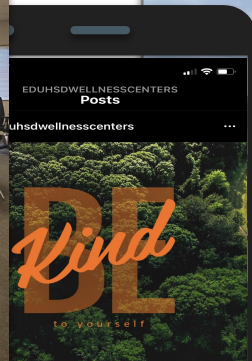
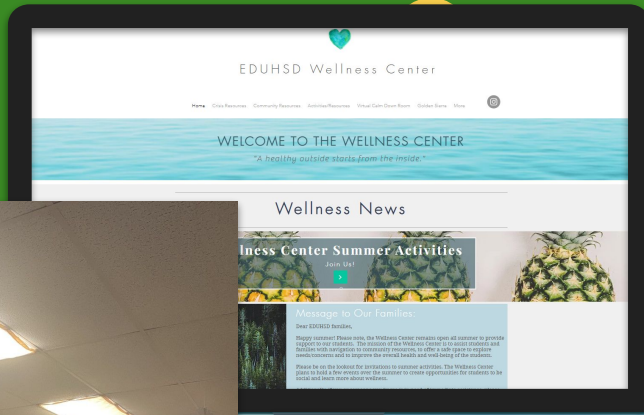
Students can request to meet with the Wellness Center directly by emailing or calling.
