patter of college preparatory
study with grades of “C-” or
better.**

Earn a Admissions GPA Index

SAT/ACT are not required

**Freshmen Requirements for
the CSU**

Social Science:2 years
English:4 years
Mathematics:3 years
Laboratory Science:2 years
LOTE:2 years
VPA:1 year
Electives:1 year

All college prep courses must
be completed with final grades
of “C-” or higher

A-G Requirements

Admissions GPA Index

Earn Qualifying Admission GPA

Admission GPA Index is comprised of student's "a-g" GPA x 1,000.

- California local high school graduates earning a 2.5 (2,500) or greater GPA
- California non-local high school graduates earning a 2.75 (2,750) or greater GPA
- Non-California high school graduates earning a 3.00 (3,000) or greater
- Any California high school graduate or resident of California earning a GPA between 2.0 and 2.49 may be based upon Multiple-Factors- Admission Criteria



Completion of a-g courses beyond the minimum

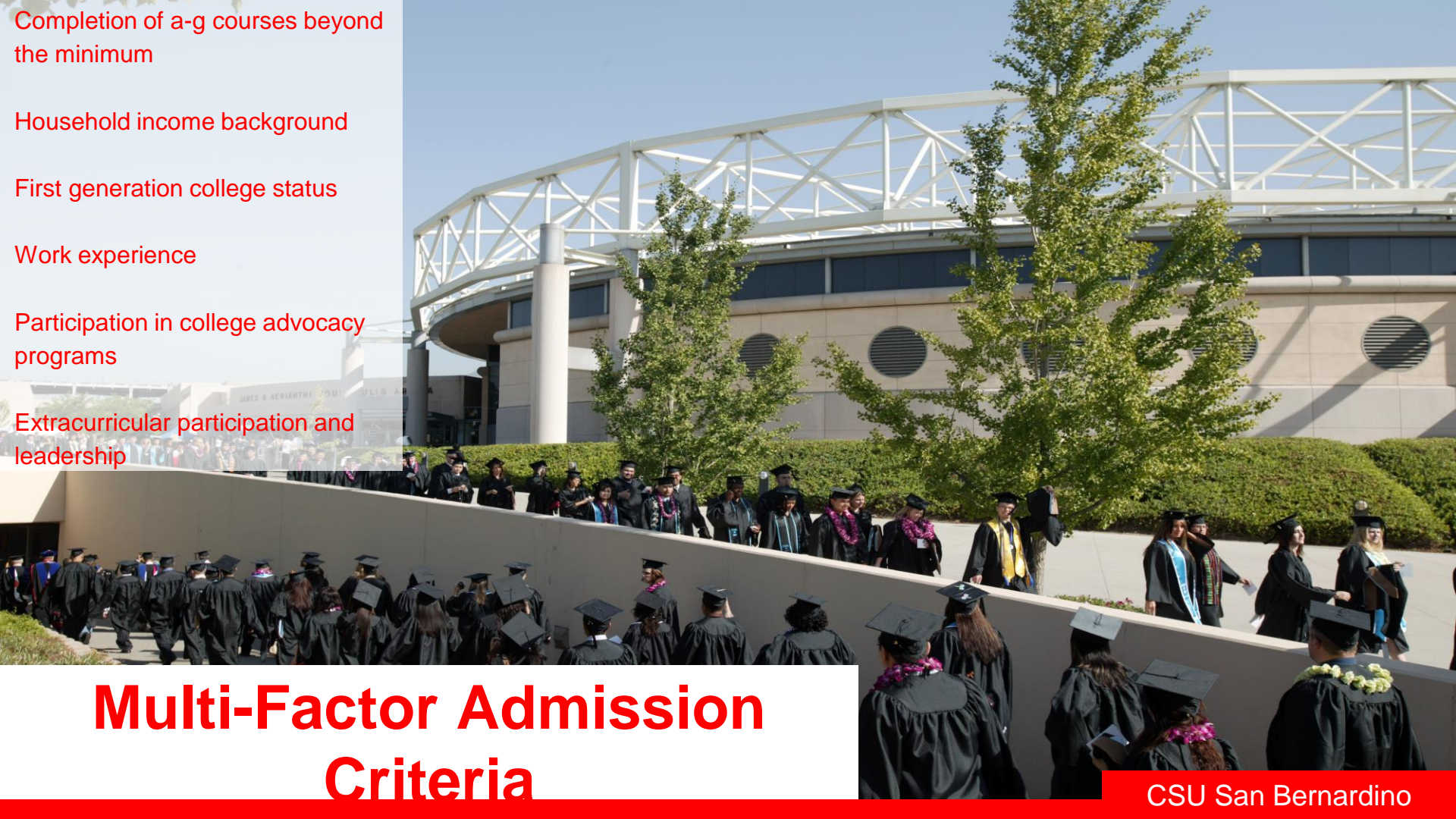
Household income background

Multi-Factor Admission Criteria

When a campus receives a greater number of applications from eligible students but not enough spaces to offer admission for all of those eligible students. Therefore, meeting the minimum requirements may not be enough to gain admission to a CSU
