

Choose ONE or more of the following options:

20 credits in World Language, Career Technical Education, or Visual/Performing Arts
 Examples: Drama & Adv. Drama, Spanish 1 & Spanish 2, or Ag mech & Adv. Ag Mech

or

Take the requirements needed to go straight to a 4-year university - "A to G"

or

3. Take at least 2 Advanced Education/Dual Enrollment classes at the local community college.





Multiple Ways to Gain PostSecondary Skills






4 Year College Option Straight out of high school

Why Attend a Community College?

- 1. Career Training
- 2. Associates Degree
- 3. Prepare to Transfer to a University
- 4. You can get a head start in college by Advanced Education Classes while in high school!



Benefits of Attending Community College

- 1. Finances less expensive \$\$\$
- 2. Academics General Education is General Education
 - a. Access to highly qualified professors (They have one single job that is to teach you)
 - b. Smaller classroom sizes
 - c. Academic flexibility
 - d. Certificate / Degree programs
- 3. Increasing your chances of getting into a 4-year university of your choice!

The UC/CSU systems have programs for transfers at CCC which is arguably the best kept secret in CA higher education.

Careers without Bachelors Degree

Examples of high-paying careers that only require an Associate Degree or CTE training

Radiation Therapist

- Median pay: \$80,160
- Job growth through 2024: 14%

• Diagnostic Medical Sonographer

- Median pay: \$69,650
- Job growth through 2024: 26.4%

Occupational Therapy Assistant

- Median pay: \$59,010
- Job growth through 2024: 42.7%

Dental Hygienist

- Median pay: \$72,910
- Job growth through 2024: 18.6%

• Geological and Petroleum Technician

- Median pay: \$56,470
- Job growth through 2024: 11.8%

What is a Trade School or Career College?

A trade school or career college sometimes referred to as a vocational school, technical school, or vocational college, is a post-secondary institution that's designed to give students the technical skills to prepare them for a specific occupation.







Apprenticeships

Training in the trades (plumber, electricians, carpenters, etc) provides SKILLED hands-on experience leading to full-time jobs.

No Enrollment Fees!

 High school students are invited to take classes and earn college credit at any California Community College through the Dual Enrollment Program. The grades earned in Dual Enrollment courses will be reflected on a student's permanent college transcript

- Dual Enrollment students may enroll in up to 11 units during any semester
- Open to all high school students




