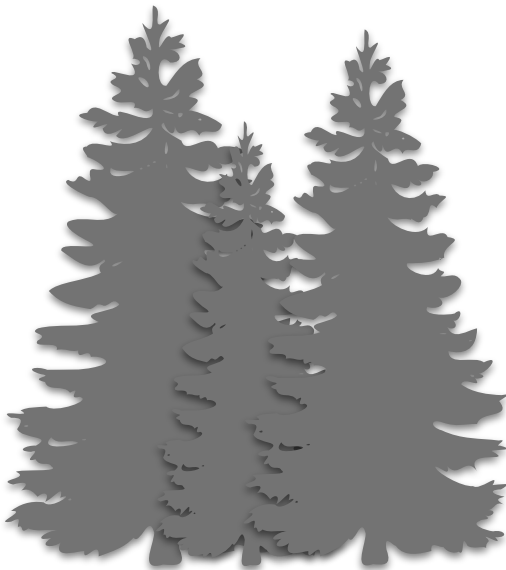

Steps to Enroll Your Student:

1. Find your high school using the school locator by clicking [HERE](#) or navigating to the school locator page at <https://eldoradohighexplorer.azurewebsites.net/>. When registering, you may only select the school for which you are assigned per your residence. In the case of dual enrollment areas where you have the option of two schools, please contact Regi Bryant at (530) 622-5081 x7229 to select your preference if you have not done so already.

2. Gather the following required documents to upload:

- a. **Proof of Residence:** To Establish proof of residency, per Education Code 48204.1, you will need to provide two documents selected from the following options (please note that statements with a P.O. Box are not acceptable):
 - Property tax payment receipt, rental agreement or mortgage statement, utility bill (PG&E, water bill, etc), pay stubs, voter registration
- b. **Up to Date Immunization Record**
- c. **Proof of Student Age:** Per Education Code 48002, the following documents may be used to establish age (Please provide one of the following):
 - Certified or original copy of Birth Certificate, Baptism Certificate, Passport, Affidavit of the parent, guardian, or custodian of the minor
- d. **Parent/Guardian Proof of Identity** - Driver's License, State ID, Military ID, passport

If applicable, but not required, please include the following:

- Copy of most recent IEP or 504 Accommodation Plan if your student receives those services
- Court documents pertaining to your student such as custody paperwork (signed by judge or clerk), guardianship or foster placement paperwork, or restraining orders against any person involving your student

If your student is a current high school student, please provide a current transcript from the former school and exit grades (if enrolling during the school year).

AP work does involve significantly more time and commitment than most high school courses; therefore, the program is intended for students seriously committed to the study of art.

3. TURN IN THE PHYSICAL to the Ponderosa Front Office/Athletic Secretary. (Monday-Friday 7:30AM-4PM)

- GRADES AND FINES will be checked by the Athletic Office prior to each season to complete eligibility requirements. Coaches will be notified when athletes are cleared.

Let's do the math to graduate...

High school is 4 years long and to graduate from Ponderosa High School you must earn 240 credits*:

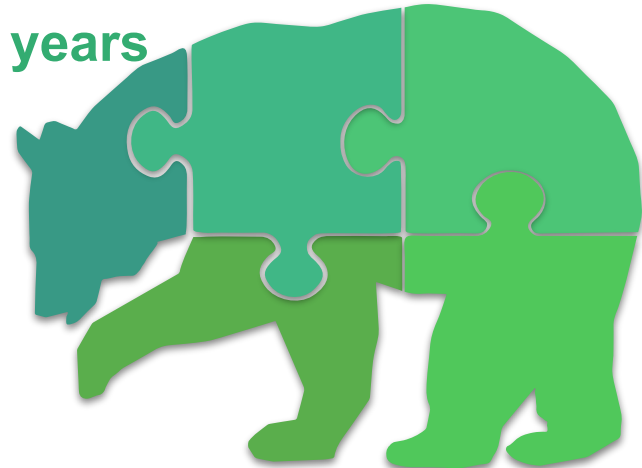
1 year long class = 10 credits

6 classes x 10 credits = 60 credits

Traditionally 6 classes taken every year for 4 years

(6 classes required 9-11th grades)

60 credits x 4 years = 240 credits

Educational Options Offered at EDUHSD



ODLP- Online Distance Learning Program

- ODLP is a year-long program offered to students grades 9-12. Students are able to learn from home while remaining enrolled in their school of residence which allows them to participate in campus athletics, special programs, clubs, dances, etc if they choose. They may even attend up to two electives on campus if space and scheduling allow.
- Core courses follow a bell schedule and are instructed synchronously 5 days/ week by EDUHSD teachers. Students must be in at least one synchronous class and offered “live” courses must be taken in this manner.
- Electives and Health/ ICT are completed independently without instruction through the online platforms of Apex and Edgenuity.
- ODLP core classes operate on a 4x4 Block schedule where students finish a year’s worth of curriculum in 1 term. Fall Term is August- December and Spring Term is January-May. You have fewer classes in a more concentrated period of time. Students may complete up to 80 credits/year.

- *ODLP applications will be available for the 2024-25 school year beginning March.*



Pacific Crest Academy

PCA is a small, early college high school adjacent to Union Mine open to all EDUHSD students. It offers a blended learning environment in which students attend and learn on campus at least two days a week. Students may work from home, Zoom in, or watch recorded lessons on days they are not on campus.

Due to its small size (34 students per grade level) instruction is more individualized.

Students may begin taking Folsom Lake courses the second semester of their freshman year. Many students graduate from PCA having completed several college credits.

Students have the opportunity to complete Internships in various fields of interest.

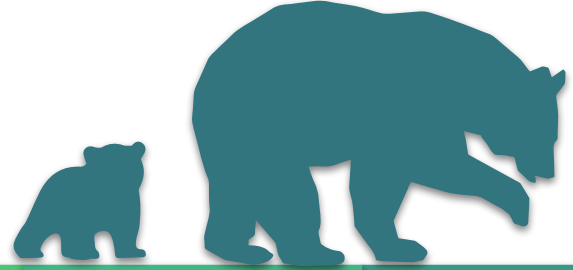
Students are “concurrently enrolled” with their school of residence (UMHS, PHS, ORHS, EDHS). They may take up to 2 classes a year (if schedule/class space allows) at their school of residence and may participate in activities such as athletics, band, drama, clubs, etc.

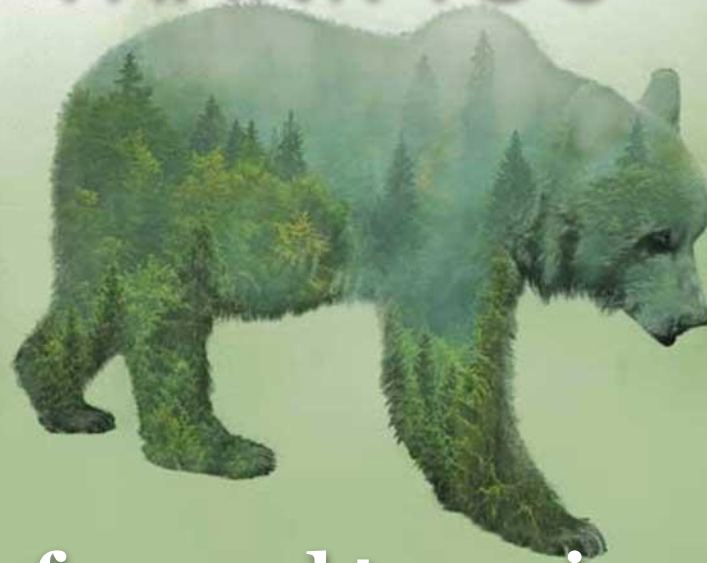
